## CAROL MANN TAKES THIRD BUCKEYE

Tall and talented Carol Mann will be representing the Cincinnati area's Royal Oak Racquet and Country Club when she defends her title in this year's Buckeye Savings Invitational.

Miss Mann, winning here last year with a 54-hole total of 207, signed a contract in April with Royal Oak golf director Jouett Brown.

The Buckeye Savings Invitational was one of three tournaments Carol won on the 1967 Ladies PGA tour. She also appropriately captured the Tall City Open and the Supertest Open to finish third in official money winnings with \$24,666.

In last year's Buckeye at Clovernook (June 22-25), the 6-3 blue-eyed blond shook off second-round back miseries to finish with a three-under-par 69 the final day and win the tourney by four strokes.

The victory was worth \$2100 from the \$14,000 purse for the gals. Clifford Ann Creed, with a 211 total, collected \$1640 for second place and Sandra Haynie, five shots back of Miss Creed, pocketed \$1360 for third.

Rain marred the early part of last year's opening-round but failed to stop Miss Mann from a sensational charge on the back nine.

She strung together four straight birdies starting at the 14th hole to shoot an opening-day 70 and share the first-round lead with Miss Creed, Susie Maxwell and Marilyn Smith.

On the second day, Miss Mann gulped down a double dose of pills to relieve her aching back and came in with a super 68, a pace matched by mighty mite Miss Creed, leaving them tied for the lead after 36 holes.

After an unprecedented interruption for a Saturday pro-am, Carol and Clifford Ann continued their torrid duel through four holes Sunday.

Then Miss Mann nosed ahead by dropping a 15-foot birdie putt at five, picked up another birdie at 13 and coasted home after Miss Creed took a double bogey at 14.

Miss Haynie, the defending champion, started the final round three strokes off the pace but soared to a 75 to finish nine shots back of Miss Mann.

### Clovernook Country Club Welcomes The LPGA

It is a little bit ironic that the perfectly landscaped fairways of Clovernook are the site of the Buckeye Savings Invitational.

It was a few years ago, but he probably still remembers them well, that Len Wirtz, the peripatetic wizard of the Ladies Professional Golfers Association, walked those fairways as a caddy.

Other famous people in golf began their careers at Clovernook. People like Tom Nieporte, who became a great professional golfer.

But for each of those that graduated from Clovernook, there have been countless others who were content to remain and savor the golfing atmosphere of one of the Cincinnati area's most delightful golf clubs.

That atmosphere was first cultivated in 1923, when there weren't such things as aluminum shafts, high compression golf balls or, for that matter, prize money for women golfers.

Archie Simpson, Jr., one of the breed of proud Scottish golf professionals, the men that established golf in America, was Clover-

nook's first golf professional, and when he died, his father, "Pop" Simpson, a wizened, forceful man, replaced him.

Just as Clovernook never forgets Len Wirtz or Tom Nieporte, it never forgot its first golf professionals, the Simpsons.

Each year in August, Clovernook holds its annual invitational, "The Carnoustie", named in honor of Archie and "Pop" Simpson, who were descended from Carnoustie, Scotland.

The Clovernook members remember the Simpsons, and Len Wirtz, and Tom Nieporte, and they also remember Dow Finsterwald shooting a 64 in one of the U.S. Open qualifiers for the competitive course record.

For years, the United States Golf Association singled out Clovernook as the spot for its U.S. Open sectional qualifier. This year, the qualifier was switched to Indianapolis, Ind. as a concession to the men professionals.

But that does not take away the memories, or the atmosphere, or the nostalgia that goes along with Clovernook.

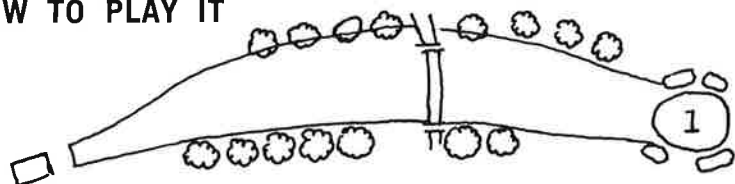

Hole #1 / 452 Yards / Par 5 / Getaway

Slight dogleg to the right. Keep tee shot well to the right to obtain maximum roll, as the fairway breaks from right to left. Second shot crosses a creek and the fairway slopes slightly upward to a very undulating green. It is best to stay straight so that you can more easily make your pitch shot.

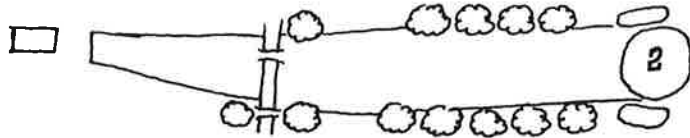

Tee shot should be placed well to the right, as the fairway slope breaks sharply to the left. Second shot is straight away and must not be too long as it is very difficult to get down in two from the back of this green which slopes from right to left.

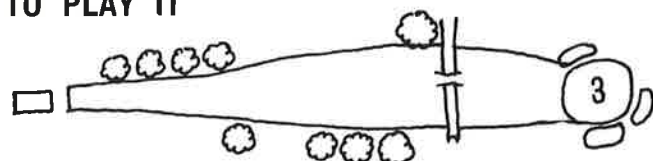

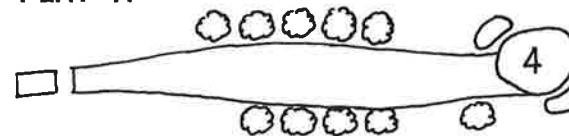
**HOW TO PLAY IT**



Hole #3 / 342 Yards / Par 4 / Plateau

Once again it is best to stay to the right side of the fairway with your tee ball in order to get greatest length. This will also put the player in a good position for his second shot of 130 to 150 yards, across the creek to a plateau green. This green is pitched toward the player and is well trapped on both sides and in the back as well.

Hole #4 / 211 Yards / Par 3 / Giant Killer

This is our longest par three hole. A fine long tee shot will reach the green which is trapped on both sides and possesses some deceiving rolls.

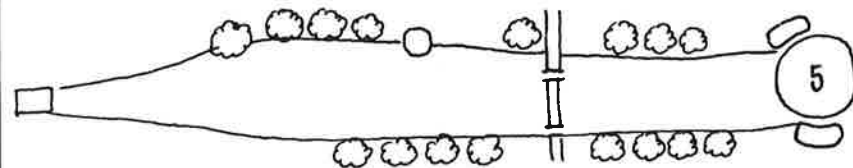

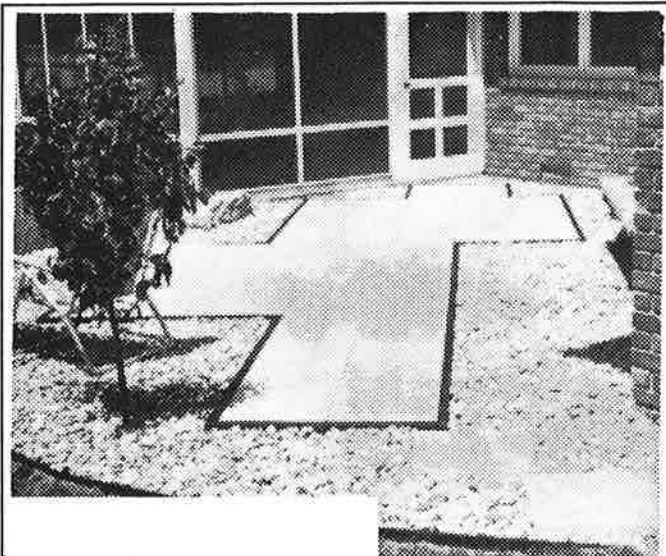

**HOW TO PLAY IT** Hole #5 / 501 Yards / Par 5 / The Oaks



This hole has a boundary to the right and a good long tee shot is a necessity in order to position the player for his second shot, which crosses a creek located 350 yards from the tee. Beyond the creek the fairway climbs a steep hill.

Your second shot must come to rest over this hill to insure a less difficult third shot to the green. The green is well trapped and has a fairly flat putting surface that breaks from back to front.

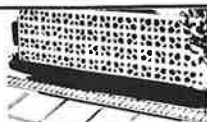


A long iron or a lofted wood is best used to reach this green which is trapped on the right and has a deep ravine to its left. Due to the slope of the green the player must carry all

the way to the pin, as there is little or no roll. The green slopes very sharply from the back to the front. This is the most difficult putting surface on our golf course.

Our longest par five hole, a slight dogleg to the right. A well hit tee shot will put the player in a slight uphill position for his second shot. Trees on the right

side of the fairway make it necessary to stay well to the left in order to have a clear third shot of a lofted or medium iron to this huge green.

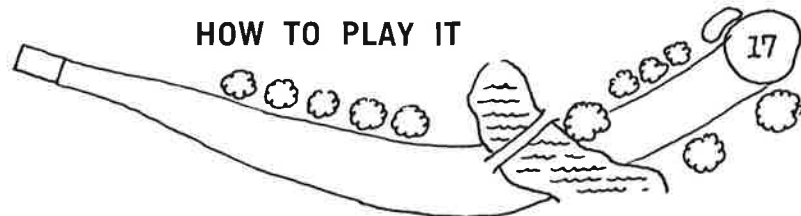

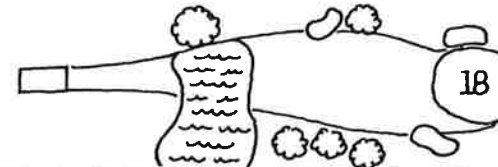
**HOW TO PLAY IT**



Hole #17 / 484 Yards / Par 5 / Lonesome Oak

In order to cross the lake on the second shot, and yet avoid the large oak which is situated in its left bank, a long tee shot directed down the right side of the fairway is required here. Once across the lake, a saddle shaped green adds to the difficulty of this hole.

**HOW TO PLAY IT** Hole #18 / 248 Yards / Par 4 / Lakeside



Our shortest par four once again crosses the lake from the tee. There is a ridge and a trap on the left side of the fairway, and a large trap to the right. A sizzling tee shot will leave the golfer with a short pitch shot to this raised green. The green has many tricky breaks and rolls.

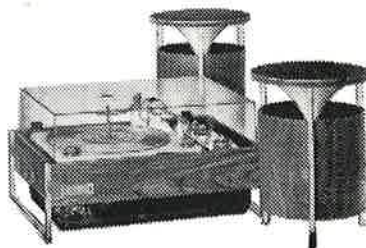
